Accreditation and Rankings

a. Second Cycle of NAAC Accreditation with A++ Grade

MRIIRS successfully completed its second cycle of NAAC Accreditation from February 15, 2023, to February 17, 2023. The institution achieved an impressive CGPA of 3.53, securing an A++ Grade. This accreditation is valid for the next five years, starting from February 20, 2023. The comprehensive evaluation included an in-depth analysis of the Institutional Grade sheet, encompassing 34 key indicators and 15 total metrics (with 36 qualitative and 79 quantitative components). Notably, MRIIRS excelled in 14 key indicators with a score of 100%, achieved a remarkable 90-100% score in 12 key indicators, and < 90% score in rest of the key indicators.

NAAC Peer Team Visit (February 2023)

The NAAC Peer Team visited the MRIIRS campus from February 15-17, 2023 for the assessment of all the Qualitative Metrics of Self Study Report as submitted by MRIIRS during the month of August 2023. On the basis of outcome of the Assessment and Accreditation (A & A) and the report of NAAC Peer Team duly approved by the Standing Committee constituted by the NAAC Executive Committee, The Manav Rachna International Institute of Research and Studies (Deemed to be University) has been Accredited with A++ Grade by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) valid for a period of five years with effect from February 20, 2023. The details of this cycle of accreditations are as below:

- SSR was submitted successfully to NAAC on August 05, 2022
- Response to DVV clarifications as received on August 19, 2022 were submitted successfully to NAAC on September 03, 2022.
- SSR of MRIIRS was approved by NAAC on December 27, 2022.

b. NBA Accreditation

MRIIRS has successfully completed the NBA accreditation process for its MBA program, securing accreditation for a duration of three years, spanning from the academic year 2021-22 to the academic year 2023-24, and falling under Tier-I.

Furthermore, two of MRIIRS's B.Tech programmes, Computer Science and Engineering, and Biotechnology, have also received renewed accreditation from the NBA in 2023. This accreditation is also valid for three years under Tier-I (valid upto June 30, 2025) based on the report submitted by the expert team post their data verification of the programmes on December 23, 2022.

c. Participation in Time Higher Education (THE) IMPACT Ranking 2023

MRIIRS has participated in Time Higher Education (THE) IMPACT Ranking 2023. The documents and details pertaining to a total of five SDGs- Zero Hunger SDG-2, Good Health and Well Being SDG-3, Gender Equality SDG-5, Clean Water and Sanitation SDG-6 and Partnership for the Goals SDG-17 were submitted on November 30, 2022.

The university has been ranked 35th in India and is ranked in the 801-1000 band globally. As per the Rankings released by THE during the first week of June 2023, MRIIRS has been ranked among the top 200 globally for clean water and sanitation (SDG-6), among the top 300 for the Sustainable Goal of Zero Hunger (SDG-2) among the top 600 for SDG5 – Gender Equality and SDG 3: Good Health & Well Being.



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E-Governance initiatives at MRIIRS

Manav Rachna International Institute of Research and Studies (MRIIRS) has subscribed to a comprehensive Cloud based EMS (Education Management System) from M/s iCloud EMS (since AY2017-18), Pune which provides integrated solution to enhance and digitize the processes including Admission, Fee, Student's academic life cycle, Transport, Hostel, Feedback, Grievance, Recruitment & HR processes and other administrative operations in the university through its web & mobile based applications. Apart from i-cloud EMS, multiple software's have been procured as per the requirement in different domains.

e-Governance prescribe policies and practices of the university in the matter of planning, implementation and offering of services through electronic-mode in the various areas of University Governance including administration, academics, examination, human resources, recruitment, training, performance appraisal, financial management, admission, placement, student and stakeholder support for efficient service delivery, improved productivity and transparency. - Implementation of Paperless Admission system on EMS to support the process of admission and reduce the consumption of paper.
- Implementation of Student Exam History Module on EMS: Student can track his/her record of examinations (Main/Reappear/PSC/Revaluation) in which he/she has previously appeared.
- Implementation of module for course registration and course mapping process for NPTEL courses on EMS: In addition to the already available result import module for NPTEL courses opted by students, EMS coordinators can now do course registration and course mapping for such courses just like regular courses.
- Implementation of Fee Clearance Module on EMS for scholarship holders, to allow students, with pending dues in case of Loan/Bihar Credit/Scholarship, for course registration admit-card generation and grade-card generation.
- Incorporation of consolidated transcript report (TR) on EMS: Transcripts of the students can now be generated through EMS.
- Upgradation of One Time Password (OTP) facility to enhance the security features of EMS by providing the IP address of the system, through which a user is trying to login his/her EMS account, along with the OTP.
- Upgradation of EMS examination module related to
- generation of course-wise detained list for sessional examinations also based on attendance in a particular course. Initially, it was available only for the End Semester Examination.
- Incorporation of minimum passing eligibility criteria on EMS:
- End Semester Examination detention list is created based on minimum attendance criteria and minimum passing marks in Continuous Internal Assessment.
- Final Grades are declared based on Continuous Internal Assessment and considering minimum passing marks criteria of End Semester Examination.
- Incorporation of all three parameters, Absent/Detained/Malpractice, in internal as well as End Semester Examination.
- Upgradation of Study Scheme Maintenance Module: Central EMS coordinators are now able to add the study scheme of a course to all the programmes having same course code.
- Upgradation of Parent's Login on EMS: All parents can access all the EMS modules through their account and track the performance of their wards, including generation of admit cards and grade cards
- Upgradation of Container facility for Reappear and PSC Courses: Container facility is now incorporated for PSC and reappear courses.

- Upgradation of range-wise attendance report to obtain the student count and percentage of students having attendance less than or more than a particular value (0-60%, 60-65%, 65-69%, 70-75% etc.)
- Circulars and notifications on official E-mail IDs through EMS: Important information/circulars are being shared with all the students/faculty members/staff members by the competent authorities by posting them through Circular Module and the same can now be sent to their official E-mail IDs through EMS.
- Incorporation of following facilities to enhance blended learning:
 - i. An increasing trend in student Enrollment and beneficiaries in terms of credit transfer for SWAYAM/NPTEL courses has been witnessed during the AY2022-23.
 - ii. Swayam Local Chapter of MRIIRS is amongst the TOP 100 Local chapters of India and is at 67th Rank with "A Grade" out of 5594 Local Chapters in Indian and 2nd in Haryana, Session Jan-Jun 2023.
- To enhance the conceptual understanding of the students, experiments were conducted using Virtual labs.
 - i. In July-Dec 2022, 2093 students used 12 Virtual labs and a total of 12 experiments were conducted in these labs.
 - ii. In Jan-June 2023, 1797 students used 19 Virtual labs and a total of 19 experiments were conducted in these labs

Conduct of Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) for AY 2021-22

As per the laid down policy of MRIIRS, Academic Audit of each department was conducted where external auditors were invited from various reputed academic institutions and suggestions were implemented by the departments concerned. Academic Audit of all the teaching units and Administrative Audit of central units under six clusters was held during Aug-Sep 2022 for AY 2021-22. Audit reports and respective ATRs were discussed during the 1st Quarterly meeting of IQAC for AY 2022-23 held on Sep 29, 2022.



Conduct of Stakeholders Feedback for AY 2021-22

Feedback from various stakeholders for AY 2021-22 was collated through i-cloud EMS in the form of Student Course Feedback; Student Satisfaction Survey comprising Feedback on Curricula and Generic Facilities; Alumni Feedback on Curricula; Employer/Industry Expert Feedback on Curricula and Faculty Feedback on Curricula.

- The feedback analysis reports, action to be taken reports on the suggestions received through stakeholder feedback and recommendations of central committee on Feedback on Curricula and Feedback on Campus Life were reviewed during the 3rd quarterly meeting of IQAC for AY 2022-23 held on April 11, 2022. The approved recommendations were shared by IQAC with all the departments on April 17, 2023 for subsequent actions. The Action Taken Reports of all the departments (academic and administrative) were discussed during the meetings of Central Committee on Feedback on Curricula and Feedback on Campus Life held on July 01, 2023. The consolidated Annual Feedback Reports of Central Committee on Feedback on Curricula and Feedback on Campus Life incorporating Action Taken Reports of all the departments were deliberated during the 4th Quarterly meeting of IQAC for the AY 2022-23 held on July 28, 2023 and got approved in the 40th meeting of Executive Council held on October 25, 2023.
- Students as major stakeholders also provided the feedback on Course Delivery. Feedback on course delivery were conducted for both the semesters of AY 2022-23 and ATRs were reviewed during the 3rd quarterly meeting of IQAC for AY 2022-23 held on April 11, 2023.

Annual Quality Assurance Report -AQAR of previous academic year 2021-22 was submitted to NAAC Successfully during the month of July 2023 and got approved. 






Staff Development Programme on MS office & Soft Skills (18-07-2022)

- Open elective marks uploading through container sheet.




Session on Fire Drills and Emergency Preparedness (04-11-2022)





FDP. In the various sessions insights were provided for various stages of curriculum design and the difference between syllabus and curriculum, their need and analysis.


The software's to detect plagiarism – Turnitin, Thenticate and Original were also discussed in detail. The message given by the speaker was to be honest while writing the manuscript, should know how to summarize the research, and be careful with any kind of plagiarism – intentional or accidental.

INFLIBNET is a Learning Management System that also includes SWAYAM, e-PG Pathshala, Swayam Prabha etc Portals etc as e-learning resources for students. Few open access initiatives taken by the INFLIBNET also include shodh-gangotri, shodh-shudhi, ICSSR (Data Science) along with Shodh-Ganga and IR. These helps an institute in various Accreditations and Rankings including NBA, NAAC, NIRF etc. He also discussed in detail about ARPIT: an annual refresher courses for teaching and teachers that is mandatory for all teachers to complete. He told about the latest service being offered by INFLIBNET i.e. Shodh-Chakra where the profiles of Guides, Scholars, researchers will be updated and work as gateway. The testing part is in process and will be launched soon. He talked about the new initiatives being taken by INFIBNET and how they can help individual and an organization.




Pedagogical Framework for Active Learning: Flipped Classrooms/Problem Solving Based/ Collaborative Learning(09-02-2023)

Internal Quality Assurance cell has organized a session on “Pedagogical Framework for Active Learning: Flipped Classrooms/ Problem Solving Based/Collaborative Learning” on February 09, 2023. The objective of the session was to apprise the participants about problem-based learning (PBL) with different collaboration learning strategies in flipped classrooms to improve learners' learning motivation and learning outcomes. The inaugural session was conducted by Dr. Naresh Grover, Hon'ble Pro Vice Chancellor, MRIIRS.

In the session, he discussed about the flipped classroom, a pedagogical approach that aims to increase student engagement by having students complete class work at home and participate in hands-on activities in the classroom. It enables students to attain a higher level of cognitive function, influencing them to grapple with, apply, and elaborate on course concepts. He also discussed that basis of flipped learning is active learning and builds on constructivism. It embraces problem-based learning, peer-assisted learning, cooperative learning, and collaborative learning under active learning. After all, flipped learning, which

stresses the instructor's role as a coach, is a pedagogical option to provide opportunities for interactive and dynamic engagement in the learning process.





Workshop on ABET Accreditation(23.05.2023)

The five students member team comprising of Nikhil Singh, Gaurang Tomar, Aayush Sadija Shubham Thakur Gaurav Saxena with faculty advisor Dr Devendra Vashist was facilitated for their innovative work on “Power Train Design of Electric Vehicle” in a grand ceremony that took place in Auditorium of International Centre for Automotive Technology (ICAT) Centre 2, Sector - 11, IMT Manesar, Gurugram, Haryana on 4.2.2023. The award to the team was given by Union Minister for Heavy Industries Dr. Mahendra Nath Pandey, MoS Heavy Industries Sh. Krishan Pal Gurjar, Secretary Shri Kamran Rizvi Ministry of Heavy Industries, Joint Secretary Dr Hanif Qureshi (Auto) MHI 3), Director ICAT Shri. Saurabh Dalela & President Automotive Component Manufacturers Association of India (ACMA) Mr Sunjay Kapoor. The facilitation was done in fully occupied Auditorium with representatives of about 1700 auto company across India. The event was organized by Mathworks (Makers of MATLAB and Simulink) in association with ICAT through their Aspire Programme. A total of 76 teams across India including IITs and NITs with 350 participants participated in the event.



Before the competition the teams were provided 4 months skill based training from Oct 2022 to January 2023 on MATLAB and Simulink where in each member of the team completed three basic courses. Dr Richa Adlakha, Assistant Professor, Electrical and Electronics Engineering Department was the part of team Agriculture and won the Best Project Award in AICTE Idea Lab 7 Days Advance Faculty Development Programme on Design Thinking organised at Ajay Kumar Garg College of Engineering, Ghaziabad from 24th to 30th May 2023. The team visited the nearby villages and discussed the problems faced by farmers. The major issue was Nilgai attacking farms and Low Water Level. After the discussion with the experts from industry and FAD lab Pune the team finalised the problem of Nilgai Destroying the farms and designed the prototype “Nilgai Ninja” using IoT which possesses the capability to protect the field from the

attack of unwanted animals. The prototype was tested in the field and villagers hope that it will give relief to their problem and was adjudged as the BEST PROJECT.



Award at Sustainathon 2023:



The Global Peace Foundation organised a National event “Sustainathon” on 11th April 2023 which supports the innovative projects in favour of environmental sustainability. A team of three students from Department of Biotechnology, MRIIRS led by Dr. Kapila Kumar, Director, Molecular Biosciences Research Cluster as mentor of the project participated in the event. The event brought together students, professionals, and experts in terms of 50 teams from various fields to brainstorm and develop innovative solutions to address sustainability challenges. MRIIRS team “Li-Koff” won the 2nd prize with the prize money of INR 15,000 for an idea aimed to achieve SDG 3 with the detection of carcinogens in a cost-effective manner using advanced technologies of synthetic biology.

Co-Solving of Water Logging and Depletion of Ground Water in District Faridabad:

Urbanization-induced rapid population growth and associated groundwater depletion have been impacting Faridabad for the last 3-4 decades. With every passing year, the problem of water logging in different parts of the city has also risen. A research project “Co-solving water logging and groundwater depletion issue in parts of Faridabad Smart City using Underground Taming of Flood water for Aquifer Storage and Recovery” funded by WTC-DST (the project is given to MRCAWTM, MRIIRS) has yielded a smart solution to these issues of Faridabad in the form of structures that facilitate quick absorption and safer discharge of rainwater to aquifer to co-solve two critical water issues in a gainful manner. A core ideology with which Manav Rachna Centre for Advanced Water Technology and Management (MRCAWTM) operates is that its initiatives should empower the community.

The Aquifer Storage and Recovery (ASR) Systems constructed by Manav Rachna Centre for Advanced Water Technology and Management (MRCAWTM), Manav Rachna International Institute of Research and Studies Faridabad (MRIIRS) were jointly inaugurated by the Deputy Commissioner Faridabad Sh. Vikram Singh, IAS; and

the Chairman, Central Ground Water Board, Sh. Sunil Kumar on 28th June 2023 at Sector 16A Faridabad in the presence of Hon'ble President MREI, Dr Prashant Bhalla; Head, Water Technology Cell, Department of Science and Technology, Dr Parveen Arora; along with other dignitaries. Director General, MREI, Dr N C Wadhwa; and Chair Professor, MRCAWTM, Dr Dipankar Saha. Principal Investigator (PI) and Co PI of the project Dr Arunangshu Mukherjee and Dr Nidhi Didwania, faculties from MRIIRS, Sh J K Bhalla, and Dr HS Saini Dr S Shekher, as associates of MRCAWTM, Members of the CAWTM team, Ms. Sneha Rai, Mr. Sandeep and Ms. Priya were also present during the event. Among others, press and electronic media personnel, members of RWA from sector 15, 15A, 16 and 16A, officials from ULBs, officers of CGWB, DSTetc were present. Co PI Dr Nidhi hosted the function.

The pilot tested sites at Sector 16 A and Sector 15 A have proved to be effective, and its success can be scaled up to other areas as well. The structures have been constructed on the land of PWD and will be handed over to PWD after the completion of the project



For further maintenance. With this visionary implementation, the future is secure and sustainable.

The prior inauguration a briefing function was organized at Circuit House Sector 16A Faridabad, where details about the ASR System and its working was first described by Dr Arunangshu Mukherjee, Principal Investigator of the project. Dr Prashant Bhalla, President MREI, highlighted the need of installing more such systems to cope up with the emerging water logging crisis in the city and requested the District Administrator to replicate such initiative in identified spots within the city. Head, Water Technology Cell, Department of Science and Technology, Dr Parveen Arora congratulated the PIs and MRIIRS for successfully implementing the project awarded to them. Sh. Sunil Kumar Chairman, Central Ground Water Board, explained the regal position of such a system and cautioned



about polluted source water for recharge. The press and electronic media and RWA members were allowed to ask questions. DC Faridabad Sh. Vikram Singh, IAS, while replying to the question raised, has appreciated the initiative taken by MRIIRS and congratulated the team Manav Rachna for successful endeavour. The event was widely covered in print and electronic media. Few glimpses are presented.



The ISR arm of MRIIRS, Dr O P Bhalla Foundation (<http://dropbhallafoundation.org/>), operates with the objectives to carry forward philanthropic and development activities in various fields like education, sustainable development, environment protection, women empowerment and gender equality, health and well being, geriatric healthcare, empowering weaker sections of society and reviving our rich cultural heritage. Serving the nation through efforts in inclusive growth, societal development, and diversity conservation, the students, and staff of MRIIRS have endeavored with great alacrity and commitment.

- **Sustainable Alternative- “Cloth Bags (creating best out of waste)”**

MRIIRS in association with Dr. O.P Bhalla foundation took up the initiative “Sustainable Alternative- Cloth Bags (creating best out of waste)” to spread awareness about the ban and also educate people about the alternatives.
