

Global education empowered by grants



Strengthening global connections through online meetings



Korea-India Business Confluence strengthens global ties




MRU faculty members shine on global platform with UNESCO's OE4BW initiative

International partnerships in Ph.D. co-supervision



EAIE Conference 2024, Toulouse, France | September 17-19, 2024

The European Association for International Education (EAIE) Conference 2024, held in the picturesque city of Toulouse, France, from September 17-19, was an enriching experience for global education leaders and practitioners. The event brought together key stakeholders to explore collaboration opportunities, share insights, and strengthen networks across international education systems.

The conference was attended by Prof. (Dr.) Deependra Kumar Jha, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Manav Rachna University, and Prof. (Dr.) Meena Kapahi, Director International Relations. They represented the institution and engaged actively in discussions on the evolving landscape of transnational education. Discussions emphasized the need to understand and appreciate diverse cultures, languages, and educational systems to foster meaningful global partnerships. Participants explored strategies for overcoming barriers and enhancing collaboration among educational institutions on an international scale. The event provided an excellent platform for exchanging ideas, building strategic partnerships, and gaining fresh perspectives on global education.

Train the Trainer Workshop, CEFAM Lyon, France | May 26 - 30, 2024



Prof. (Dr.) Pragati Chauhan, School of Management and Commerce, participated in the "Train the Trainer" workshop organized by Marketplace Simulations USA at CEFAM, Lyon, France, from 26 to 30 May, 2024. The workshop, led by Dr. Ernest Cadotte and four other coaches, provided an immersive business simulation experience. The 4-day workshop planned incorporating a tour of the city, teambuilding-exercises,

discussions, networking dinners. It was attended by experts from Germany, Canada, France, USA, Spain, Luxembourg.

Challenging dynamics of internationalization of higher education

Internationalization of higher education has always been a subject of animated debate among competing minds and advanced nations. This brings the realists to ponder over various aspects relating to the core of the subject so as to rediscover more though there is a well established set of ideas for understanding the present system of education.

Emerging education entities invariably enquire about various hurdles faced by the established players. They strive to bring drastic changes in the dominant norms of the system in order to give momentum to their own interests and practices. Naturally, there arise conflicts and tensions among the nations, and the experts are divided in their opinions with regard to these conflicts that broadly revolve around the power shifting or power transition. Furthermore, the theorists differ as to whether conflict derives more from the actions of revisionist powers those are pioneering to rebuild the rules of international affairs- that includes socio, economic and educational cultural ties, or from the status quo powers which have growing apprehensions to preserve their supremacy.

Recently India and Germany launched an Indo-German Partnership for Green and Sustainable Development. Under this, Germany has committed to provide additional development assistance of 10 billion dollars till 2030 to support India's green growth plans.

This partnership includes joint efforts in sustainable urban development, energy transition, environmental protection. Additionally, countries finalized a Comprehensive Migration and Mobility Partnership (CMMP), facilitating the movement of students, professionals, and researchers, while addressing illegal migration challenges. The Prime Minister of India deliberated that many countries had benefited from India's skilled workers and professionals and the migration and mobility agreement with Germany will facilitate movement between the two sides at a time when India is witnessing the fastest growth in the post Covid19 era as compared to the other developing This agreement highlights the economies. importance of systemic cooperation and regional integration in advancing international education.
