A meeting of the Academic Council was held on 24.09.2015 in the Board Room, A-Block, MRIU, Faridabad.

They were granted leave of absence by the Chair.

The following are the minutes of the meeting:



11 Opening remarks by the Chairman:

The Chairman welcomed the Members and said that this auspicious day for the meeting has been chosen being birthday of our Hon'ble Chancellor Dr. Prashant Bhalla; and on his personal behalf and on behalf of the Academic Council he wished him a very pleasant, long and healthy life. He also remembered our visionary founder Late Dr. O.P. Bhalla for the commendable service he has done for the Society by creating such a knowledge Hub in the Faridabad. He extended a special welcome to Prof. Bhatnagar and Prof. R.K. Singh and hoped that with their presence in the Council, the University will be immensely benefitted. He introduced the Hon'ble members with other members of the Academic Council and requested that every member should introduce themselves with the eminent members of the Council. The Chairman then mentioned in brief the journey of the Manav Rachna Institutions right from Nineties and as to how erstwhile MRCE acquired the State Private University status in 2014. With these words, he concluded his remarks and requested the Registrar to carry out the proceedings of the Council.

The Registrar took up the Agenda No. 2 of the meeting and requested the Dean (Academic) to make a presentation on the functioning of the University, academic programs and the way it is planned to be carried forward during the year. In her presentation, Dean (Academic) highlighted the salient points of the Ordinances based on which the course curriculums for various UG/PG programs have been designed. She talked about the Mission/Vision of the University, as to how it is translating the Mission statements into action, differentiators which give us an edge over others, skill development and global graduate attributes etc. that puts the MRU apart from similarly placed other high institutions of learning. With these highlights, she ended the presentation.

The chairman, then, requested Prof. Bhatnagar and Prof. Singh to say few words on the occasion. Prof. Bhatnagar shared his experience of IIT, Delhi and said, this being first meeting of the Academic Council, it is very important for us to imbed good practices through which students could derive mileage out of it and help the University to acquire high ranking from 10 to 9,8& so on in future. Prof. R. K. Singh thanked to the Chair for putting him on the board and inviting to attend the meeting of the Academic Council. He mentioned that these days everyone is talking about the inter-disciplinary or multi-disciplinary programs but when it comes to execution or fulfillment of the cause of the Society, we are complete failure and try to shirk from the responsibility. Our programs to be designed in such a way that students passing out from the institutions should not hesitate to own up the social/corporate responsibility. With these words, he concluded his remarks.



The agendas were thereafter taken one by one for discussion by the Registrar.

1.2 About the University and Academic Programs started from the Session, 2015-16.

The Members were apprised that Manav Rachna College of Engineering, run by Uthan Educational Trust since 2004 now stands upgraded as a State Private University by Haryana Government vide its Notification No. Leg.32/2014, dated 06.08.2014 notified in the Haryana Govt. Gazette (Extra Ordinary).The University has been listed at SI. No. 18 in the Schedule 2 of the Principal Act vide The Haryana Private Universities (Second Short Title Amendment) Act, 2014, It was also reported that Section 24 of the Act provides for the constitution and functions of the Academic Council, some of the salient provisions of which are as follows;

The Academic Council shall be the Principal Academic body of the University and shall, be subject to the provisions of the Act as amended from time to time, Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations or Rules of the University co- ordinate and exercise general supervision over the academic policies of the University.

The Vice Chancellor shall be the Chairperson of the Academic Council. The quorum for meetings of the academic Council shall be such as may be specified by the Statues which provide that Two-Fifth of the members of the Academic council shall constitute the quorum at a meeting. The Academic Council shall meet at least thrice in a calendar year.

Further, Section 34A (3) provides that the University shall not commence first enrollment of students without specific authorization of the Government. (Approval of the Government was received from the Director General Higher Education Haryana vide their letter, dated 08.12.2014 and same has been reiterated in our communication dated 13.01.2015 sent to Department of Higher Education, Haryana, Panchkula.

The Section 35(1) prescribes that admission in the University shall be made strictly on the basis of merit provided that admission in the professional and technical courses shall be made only through entrance test.

The academic Programs were covered in the presentations, hence not repeated again.

Decision: Academic Council took the above information on record.



1.3 Matters for Information

i) Vision and Mission of the University:

The Academic Council was informed that the Board of Management in its first meeting held on 10.03.2015 approved the Vision and Mission of the University as follows:

Vision

Centre for knowledge generation, dissemination and transfer in the frontier areas, which derive impetus from various disciplines of sciences, humanities and technology and generates globally relevant human resource and knowledge which addresses the future issues / needs of society.

Mission

- i) To impart outcome based holistic education
- ii) To disseminate education in frontier areas
- iii) To produce globally competitive; ethical and socially responsible human resources.
- iv) To produce human resources sensitive to issues of Environment and Sustainable Development
- v) To develop Environment and Sustainable development as thrust area of research and development.

ii) Creation of Faculties and Departments:

It was submitted for information of the Academic Council that as per the provisions in the Clause 29 of the First Statutes, the following Faculties and Departments have been created with the approval of Board of Management:

iii) Constitution of Board of Studies of the Academic Departments

The Academic Council was informed that Board of studies has been constituted for all the Academic Departments, as per the provisions in the proposed Statues.

iv) Submission of First Statues and First Ordinance leading to award of B. Tech, M. Tech, MBA, Ph. D Degrees etc. to the government for its approval and status thereof.

Academic Council was apprised that First Statues of the University prepared by the Governing body as per the provisions prescribed in the Act was submitted to the government for its approval vide letter, dated 06.09.2014. The Department of Higher Education, Haryana vide their letter, dated 13.03.2015 conveyed their observation advising therein that some statues need to be elaborated. Accordingly, the Statues were revised and re-submitted to the Department of Higher Education on April 1, 2015. The Department has now forwarded the observation given by the committee constituted by the government to give final report on the draft vide their letter dated 25.08.2015, it has been accordingly revised and submitted to the DHE on 22.09.2015 for further action.

As far as the First Ordinance relating to Admission to the Courses of Study, Conduct and Evaluation of Examination for Under Graduate and Post-Graduate Programs leading to award of Bachelor of Technology, Master of Technology/ Post Graduate Diploma and Master in Business Management Degrees of the University, prepared by the Vice-Chancellor was approved by the Board of Management in its First meeting held on 10th March, 2015. The approved ordinance was submitted to the government for their approval on 1st April, 2015.

Subsequent Ordinance on Ph. D Program was also prepared and submitted to the Government for their approval on May 7, 2015. The Directorate of Higher Education, Haryana Government, Panchkula has constituted a committee to examine the ordinances. The Committee reviewed the First Ordinance on 20.06.2015 and



suggested that subsequent Ordinance on Ph.D. Program be also added in the First Ordinance, which is accordingly revised for perusal and discussion with committee in the next meeting which is yet to take place.

vi) Ranking of the MRU (erstwhile MRCE) among private Engineering institutions I other Engineering Institutions of repute

The members of the council were informed that MRU (erstwhile MRCE) ranked 10th among the private engineering Institutes of the country and 30th among all the engineering institutes including IITs and NITs in Times Engineering survey, June 16th, 2015. It has also received 'Excellent Engineering Institute in Haryana' award of CMAI National Haryana Education Awards, 2014.

vii) Constitution of Anti Ragging Committee, Anti Ragging Squads & Women Cell of the University:-

The Academic council was informed that the University has constituted University level Anti Ragging Committee and Anti Ragging Squads to check the menace of Ragging in the campus in conformity with the guidelines issued by the UGC. A Women Cell has also been constituted to provide gender sensitive information, create awareness among the students and to ensure a congenial work atmosphere in the campus so that women at MRU may not feel any gender specific discrimination. The cell has also been empowered to act as a Departmental Competent Committee to deal with the cases of sexual harassment of women at work place/Institutions as per the direction passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and guidelines framed by the Govt.

viii) Scholarship / Free-ship Policy

The council was also informed that University has been offering Meritorious Students Scholarship & Merit-cum Means Scholarship to the students admitted to UG/PG programs in the form of Tuition Fee Waiver.

The Meritorious Students Scholarship is awarded to the Students admitted to UG/PG Programs in the following manner:-

- a) B. Tech. Programs- Those who have scored 90% or above marks, in aggregate, in class 12th Examination are awarded Full Tuition Fee waiver.

Academic Council was further informed that as per Section 35(3) of the Haryana Private



b) M. Tech. & MBA Programs — Those who have scored

80% and above	100% Tuition Fee Waiver
75% and above but below 80%	50% Tuition Fee waiver
70% and above but below 75%	25% Tuition Fee waiver

c) B.Sc.(Hons) — Those who have scored marks, in aggregate, in class 12th Examination are awarded Tuition Fee waiver as under:-

90% and above	100% Tuition Fee Waiver
85% and above but below 90%	50% Tuition Fee waiver
80% and above but below 85%	25% Tuition Fee waiver

Such Students are required to pay other fee as applicable to the program

concerned. Condition for Continuation of Scholarship:-

Scholarship is awarded initially for a Semester & thereafter reviewed every Semester for Continuation, based upon his/her performance in the Semester. For continuation of Scholarship, the Students shall be required to:

- Maintain a minimum CGPA of 7.75,
- Minimum 75% attendance in all courses in each Semester and
- Register for all courses and earns credits for these courses as defined in curriculum scheme of program of admission i.e. the Student shall not pursue the Semester in under load mode (registering for lesser number of credits).

If the students fail to satisfy any of the above, Scholarship award shall be withdrawn. Scholarship once withdrawn, due to the violation of the above stated criteria, shall not be rewarded to the student concerned during the course of study.

Merit-cum-Means Scholarship

admission in the university shall be reserved for the student of state of Haryana, out of which 10% seats shall be reserved for the students belonging to Scheduled Caste of the State of Haryana. Further, Section 36(2) of the Act prescribes that the **fee structure for the twenty-five per cent of the students who are domicile of Haryana** shall be based on merit —cum-means and be as follows:

- i) One-fifth of the twenty-five per cent shall be granted full fee concession;



- ii) two-fifth of the twenty-five per cent shall be granted fifty per cent fee concession;
- iii) the balance two-fifth of the twenty-five per cent shall be granted twenty-five per cent fee concession;

In accordance with the provision in the Act, University has been offering Merit cum Means Scholarship in the form of Tuition Fee Waiver to all the students covered under the above category whose parents' annual income from all Sources is not more than Rs.2.8 Lacs. Such students are also required to pay other fees as applicable to the program concerned.

Prof. Singh pointed out that the condition for continuation of the Scholarship is too stringent, in case a candidate fails to perform in the first semester due to any genuinereason, as perthe existing policy he/she would be debarred from the scholarship in the next semester. He is of the view that it should be looked into and there should be provision for two semesters at least for evaluating the performance of the students. This was taken note and it was resolved that a committee would be constituted to examine such cases.

ix)Relaxation of Marks in Minimum eligibility criteria for admissions to B.Tech., M. Tech., MBA and newly introduced B.Sc.(H) programs during the Academic Session 2015-16.

The members were apprised that for the purpose of determining Minimum Eligibility Criteria, a relaxation of 5% Marks has been given to the candidates belonging to Women, SC/ST, BC, OBC, Kashmiri Migrants, North East States (Seven), Sports Personnel (with authorized participation at national level)Son/Daughter of defense Personnel categories and Foreign Nationals.

x) Fee Structure applicable to B. Tech. I M. Tech. /MBA /B.Sc.(H) & Ph. D Programs



Academic council was informed that following fee structure has been approved by the Board of Management for the session 2015-16 in respect of UG/PG programs offered by the University.

Prof. Singh pointed out that a perusal of the Fee Structure applicable in r/o B.Tech./MBA programs revealed that in case of Indian Students, there is a huge difference of fee but in case of NRI/PIO/FN, it is kept same, he asked for the reason behind it. The Chairman resolved that this issue shall be placed before the Board in the meeting.

xi) Inclusion of the name of the University in the list of Universities maintained by the UGC.

The academic Council was informed that the name of Manav Rachna University has been included in the list of universities maintained by the Universities on its website www.ugc.ac.in. This has been conveyed by the Under Secretary, UGC vide letter No. F.8-1712015(CPP-i/PU), dated 09.09.2015. It has been emphasized in the communication that the inclusion of the name of the University in the list of Universities maintained by the UGC does not by itself allow the University to make admissions in the programs. This may be done only after creation of required academic and physical infrastructure facilities, including library, laboratories and appointment of teaching and supporting staff as per the norms and standards laid down by the UGC and Statutory Council(s) concerned.

This was applauded by all the members present in the meeting.

Decision: Academic Council took the all the above information on record with the stipulation that condition for continuation of Merit Scholarship in r/o item x) should be applied on the basis of marks/attendance requirement for two semesters and a Committee be constituted to examine such cases. Also Fee Structure for Indian Students & NRI/P10/FN in r/o B.Tech. Program be reviewed by the Board.



1.4) Adoption of Choice Based Credit System, the details of UG, PG Programs to be offered during 2015-16 and consideration of Course Curriculum & Scheme of Examination for the programs

Academic Council was apprised that a core group of the faculty members including Deans (UG & PGS &R) have carried out an extensive exercise to formulate the modalities regarding introduction of choice based credit system (CBCS) in our course curriculum of the under graduate and post graduate programs proposed to be offered from the Academic Session 2015-16 and to prepare the Scheme of Examination for the same. The salient features of the CBCS, adoption of which has been made mandatory by the UGC and the scheme of the examination and course curriculum were tabled in the meeting for consideration of the Hon'ble members of the Academic Council.

The Academic council has further apprised that the following academic programs would be offered during the academic year 2015-16. All the B. Tech. and M. Tech. Programs are approved by the AICTE for the erstwhile MRCE

B. Tech Programs:

- i) Computer Science & Engineering (180),
- ii) Electronics and Communication Engineering (120),
- iii) Mechanical Engineering (180)
- iv) Information Technology (120)

B.Sc. (Honors) Programs:

- i) Physics (40)
- ii) Chemistry (40)
- iii) Mathematics (40)

M. Tech Programs:

- i) M. Tech in Computer Engineering (18)

It may be pertinent to mention that new Programs B.Sc. (H) in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics were introduced from the current session after getting approval from the Govt. of Haryana vide DHE letter No.KW/20/5 – 2013 UNP (5), dated 17/07/2015. As far as other UG/PG programs in Engineering & Management, these programs were also offered under erstwhile Manav Rachna college of Engineering up to last academic year 2014-2015. However, intake in respect of two B. Tech Programs in Mechanical Engineering and Computer science & Engineering has been increased from 120 to 180 during the current Academic Session.

The academic Session for the above programs started on different dates; The B. Tech. Programs commenced from 20th of July, 2015; M. Tech programs commenced from 24th August, 2015, MBA Program commenced from 06th August, 2015 and B.Sc.(Hons) Programs commenced from 24th August, 2015. A copy of program structure is annexed as Annexure No-I

Decision : Academic Council approved the adoption of Choice Based Credit System, UG & PG programs to be offered and the course curriculum & scheme of examinations for the programmes to be offered from the academic Session 2015-16. Academic Council also approved that all the UG & PG programmes to be introduced by the university in future shall be in CBCS mode only

1.5) Approval of admissions made in B. Tech, M. Tech, MBA & B.Sc. (H) Programs for the session 2015-16

Academic Council was informed that process of admission to all the B. Tech, M. Tech. and MBA Programs for the session 2015-16 was started in the month of April-May, 2015 with the issuance of the admission Notice in leading Nationals Dailies & uploading of the same on the university website www.mru.edu.in Online applications were invited from the candidates for all the UG/PG Programs up to a specified date i.e. 10th June,



2015. First round of counseling for B. Tech Program was held from 18.06.2015 to 20.06.2015. The counseling for M. Tech. Program was held on 22.06.2015 and for MBA program, it was held on 24.06.2015. Thereafter, it was held on walk in basis for the remaining vacant/lapsed seats from 20th/24th June, 2015 on day to day basis for all the UG/PG programs. The admissions are still continued and will close on 30.09.2015 i.e. last date for closing of admissions.

Admissions to the above Programs were made on the basis of criteria given below;

Bachelor of Technology (Duration-4 years)

1. Candidates having passed 10+2 with 65% aggregate marks with Physics , Mathematics and English
2. Merit of the candidates were prepared in the following manner:
 - i) The Candidates have been declared eligible in JEE Main Exam, 2015 were given 1st Preference and their merit was drawn by giving 60% weightage of JEE(Main) 2015 and 40% weight age of aggregate marks in qualifying examinations.
 - ii) The Candidates have been declared eligible in Uni-Gauge Exam, 2015 were given 2nd Preference and their merit was drawn by giving 60% weightage of Uni-Gauge 2015 and 40% weight age of aggregate marks in qualifying examinations.
 - iii) In the absence of candidates declared eligible in JEE (Main)/Uni-Gauge, 2015, admissions • were made on the basis of aggregate Marks in qualifying examination i.e Senior Secondary Examination.

Master of Technology (Duration — 2 Year)

- 1) Candidates having scored 55% or more marks in B.E/B. Tech Examination in the relevant discipline are equivalent. The candidates with degree in MCA, M. Sc. (Phy) / M. Sc. (Elect.) with minimum 45% marks were also considered eligible for admission to M. Tech(CSE) & M. Tech (ECE) programs respectively.



- 2) The candidates with valid GATE Scores in the relevant discipline will be given 1st preference and admissions were made on the basis of Merit in GATE.
- 3) In the absence of GATE candidates, admissions for the remaining seats were made on the basis of Marks Secured in the qualifying degree Examination.

Master of Business Administration (Duration — 2 Year)

- 1) Candidates having Bachelor degree in any discipline from a recognized university or equivalent with minimum 55% or pass in the Final Examination conducted by the institute of Chartered Accountant of India/Institute of Cost and Work Accountants of India/Institute of Company Secretaries of India.
- 2) The Candidate having declared eligible in CAT/MAT/XAT were given 1st preference and admissions were made on merit in their respective examination.
- 3) In the absence of CAT/MAT/XAT qualified candidates, admissions for the remaining seats were made on the basis of Marks Secured in the qualifying degree Examination, followed by group discussion & Personal Interview.

The process for admissions to newly introduced **B. Sc. (H) programs in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics** was started after getting approval from the government .Online applications were invited for all the three disciplines with Intake 40 in each program from 24.07.2015 Onwards. The candidates having passed plus 2 examination with 50% & more marks in aggregate of three science Subject (Phy, Chem, Maths/ Bio for B.Sc.(Hons) Chemistry and Phy, Math. & Chem. for B.Sc.(Hons)Physics & B.Sc.(Hons) Mathematics) were eligible to apply for these programs. The admissions were made on the basis of marks obtained in qualifying Examination. The first Counseling was held from August 18, 2015 and then on walk-in basis which is continued.

1.5 Introduction of New Programs from the Acad. Session, 2016-17

It was submitted for information of the Hon'ble members that the University could not add more new programs in its first session as decision to start its formal functioning was taken at the fag end of the last academic year and there was little time left to act on it and seek approval from the Govt. which is pre-requisite for starting any new Program by the University. In spite of the time constraints, a proposal was submitted to the Directorate of Higher Education for permission to start the B.Sc. (H) programs in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics and B.Ed. and 4 years integrated programs in B.A B.Ed. & B. Corn. B.Ed. to start the same from the academic session 2015-16. The DHE, Panchkula, Haryana did not agree for starting Bachelor of Education Programs because of their policy decision not to give permission to any institution to start the Bachelor of Education program during the year 2015-16 but conveyed approval for all the three B.Sc. (H) programs for which admission process was started with intake 40 in each Program.

A need was felt to introduce new UG/PG programs for which infrastructure is available or may be put in place with small investment in the existing set up of the University. Accordingly, it was decided to start the following UG/PG Programs from the academic session 2016-17:

Prof. Bhatnagar and Prof, Singh were sceptical about the new Program in BBA with specialization in Real Estate for the reasons that there is already slum in the Real Estate and by doing so we are narrowing the field of employment of the students. There scope of employment in other field will be totally blocked. Similar were their views about MBA with specialization in all the three areas. Both were of the view that specialization may be internal within the duration of the Programs as that would keep the options open for the students in other areas. After deliberation it was unanimously decided that matter would be placed before the board for the consideration.

Decision: Academic Council approved the introduction of all the proposed UG/PG Programs with the stipulation as mentioned in the last para of the Agenda.

1.6 Enrollment of Students under Ph.D. Program and its commencement from 14th January, 2016

It is submitted for information of the Council that it is proposed to start the Ph.D. Program from the January, 2016 in accordance with the provisions prosed in the First Ordinance which is under approval of the Government. The university is of the view that it should initially choose those areas in which faculty members are available and has their specialty. Accordingly, admissions are proposed to be made in the area of Engineering, Applied Sciences and Management.

As per the provision in the Ordinance, the university shall invite applications twice in an academic year i.e.in Jan/July for admission to the Ph.D. Programs. Applicants shall be required to make online application on payment of Rs.1200/- as application fee. Fee structure for the session 2015-16 shall be the same as prescribed in the Admission Brochure.

The total number of seats shall be fixed keeping in view the norms laid down by the UGC. The candidates admitted to the Ph.D. Program shall be eligible to receive JRA of Rs.10000/- for 12 months from the date of registration and SRA @ Rs.15000/-p.m. for next 12 months for the minimum duration of the Program. Besides, the scholars shall be eligible to get Contingent grant @ Rs.8000/- per annum during the period of two years. Thereafter, the candidates shall have to bear the expenses on their own if they fail to submit the Thesis within two years.

Decision: Academic Council approved the proposal.

1.7) Consideration of Programme Structure and syllabus of the UG and PG Programmes to be offered to the first batch of the University from Academic Session 2015-16

It is submitted that Academics Departments functioning under the Faculty of Engineering, Faculty of Applied Sciences and Faculty of Mangement & Humanities have proposed the program structure and scheme of examination for the B.Tech, M.Tech, B.Sc (H) and MBA



programs approved to be offered from the Academics year 2015-16. The details of programs offered under different faculties are illustrated below;

Faculty of Engineering: B.Tech Computer Science & Engineering, B.Tech Mechanical Engineering, B.Tech Electronics & Communication Engineering, M.Tech Computer Engineering, M.Tech Mechanical Engineering & M.Tech Electronics & Communication Engineering

Faculty of Applied Sciences: BSc. (Hons.)Chemistry, BSc. (Hons.)Physics & BSc. (Hons.) Mathematics

Faculty of Management & Humanities: MBA

Programme Structure & syllabus for all the programmes were deliberated at length by the respective Board of Studies of the departments followed by the discussions in Board of Faculties. The Programme Structure & detailed Syllabus for all the above programs were tabled in meeting for consideration for consideration Academic Council. It was duly deliberated and approved by the Council.

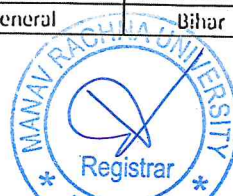
