The following are the minutes of the meeting:

2.1 Opening remarks by the Chairman:

The Chairman welcomed the Members present in the meeting and introduced the new members of the Academic Council. He mentioned that Prof. (Dr) V.K. Mahna, Pro Vice Chancellor has been long associate and stalwarts of Manav Rachna Group; prior to joining this University he served the Organization in various capacities such as Principal, erstwhile MRCE, Controller of Examination and Pro- Vice Chancellor of MRU our consanguine University. The Council will be immensely benefited with his knowledge and expertise in Academics. Prof. Jay R. Bhatnagar, who has recently joined the University as Professor in the Department of Computer Science and Technology, has an extensive exposure of 15 Years in education and research with premier Institutions in USA and India. The academic environment in the Department is going to have a great boost with his expertise and research orientation in the field. Prof. Rajiv Nanadan Rai who has joined the Department of Mechanical Engineering, has rich and diversified experience of 20 year plus of working in Indian Air force. A far sighted person with high skills, his presence in the Department and the council shall make it capable to achieve new horizons. He also mentioned about other three new members of the Council, namely, Prof. (Dr). Rajat Gera, HoD, Department of Management & Commerce, Ms. Hanu Bhardwaj, HoD, Department of Computer Science & Technology and Ms. Sangeeta Banga, Dean/ Director Students Welfare who have been nominated as Members of the Council and applauded the efforts put forth by them in growth of their Departments and the University at large. He extended a warm welcome to all the new members of the Council. He also put on record his appreciation to the outgoing members, namely, Prof.(Dr) Nand Kumar, Professor, CSE, Prof (Dr) Charu Pathak, Professor, CSE, Prof. (Dr) S. Duggal , Professor, Management, Ms. Shailee Chaudhary, Ex HoD, CSE for their contribution in deliberations of the Council.

The Chairman further stated that the University has been doing well on all the fronts. This year, we have been able to enhance our admissions almost three times of the last academic session. Two new programs are proposed to be inducted from the ensuing academic session 2017-18 viz. Bachelor of Education and Bachelor of Law. The Approval from the Govt. and NCTE has been received for the B.Ed. and Integrated B. Ed. Programs. As far as law program is concerned, the approval of the Govt. for starting the program has been received. The program will be offered under the Dept. of Law/Faculty of Law creation of which has been approved by the Board of Management in its Fourth Meeting held on 28.09.2016, Now, we are in the process of submitting the Application to the Bar Council of India which is a Regulatory Body having authority to grant recognition/permission for commencement of Law programs.



He further said that, due to strenuous efforts of the faculty and officers the University is able to conduct examinations and declare results well in time for which all deserved accolades. He further talked about the ongoing research work carried out by the Departments and informed that as a University much more needed to be done on this front, we have therefore targeted that by end of 2017 all facilities for Phd. Program should be put on place. He also mentioned about the placements being offered to the students of the University by various companies visiting the campus for placement. He further informed that Accenture has recruited 65 Students this year for which Ms. Meenakshi Gupta, Assistant Professor/ Placement officer, Department of Computer Science & Technology and Department of Electronic Communication & Engineering deserve accolades. Last year they had recruited 42 Candidate. With these words, he concluded his remarks and requested the Registrar to carry out the proceedings of the Council. 3.4 Matter for information

The Hon'ble Members of the Council were apprised of the achievements made by the Faculty/Students, MoU, Agreements and Industrial Collaborations and important events that took place during the last 9 Months. A presentation in this regard was made by the Dean, Academics covering the points as under:

(a) Faculty Achievements

i) **Prof. (Dr.) Sanjay Srivastva, Vice Chancellor** has achieved the distinction of being nominated as **LAHTI UAS Honorary Research Fellow** by the LAHTI University as a token of long and meaningful contribution made by him to the University and collaboration in academic & other efforts. This honorary position entitles him to

- Prof. (Dr.) Sanjay Srivastava (VC, MRU & MD, MREI) has been awarded Honorary Research Fellowship of Lahti University of Applied Sciences (LAMK-UAS), Finland. He is amongst the only Three Research Fellows of LAMK-UAS Helsinki and is the First Asian Honorary Research Fellow of LAMK-UAS. MRU and Wiley India have entered into a professional arrangement. Wiley India is a subsidiary of John Wiley and Sons inc., the *numero uno* publishing company in the world. They have an education vertical through which they have forged a partnership with Purdue University. This partnership with Wiley shall lead to launching of cutting edge online courses directly by the Purdue University to students. In the current semester an **online course on 'Sustainability Strategies' is being offered to the B**



Tech (2015-19 Batch) and MBA (2015-16) Batch. A total of 154 students are enrolled for the course. The course is being offered under the elective basket theme 'Environmental Ethics & Sustainability Development'.

(iii) iCarnegie:

iCarnegie, a subsidiary of Carnegie Mellon University, Pittsburgh USA and MREI have signed an MoU to share their Learning Management System covering subjects related to Computer Engineering/ Information Technology with MRU for its students studying in B.Tech Programmes. **iCarnegie's Software development program (SDP-02) was carried out in workshop mode for B.TECH 2015-19 (CSE,IT,ME,ECE) students.** While learning how to develop simple java applications, the students got experience of using application interfaces, abstraction, generalization, and other crucial engineering concepts using objects as a key strategy to control complexity and support reuse. Using basic design concepts such as flowcharts, pseudo-code and Unified Modeling Language (UML) diagrams while developing applications, producing useful client-side applets and standalone applications, based on realistic requirements similar to those they would receive from an actual client or employer.

This association will enable students to work on industry products/projects assignments of Venture 7 and/or their customers. **Students will get hands-on in manual/automated testing by working on many live projects like BookMyTrain, Snapdeal, Grofers, Gaana, Curofy and many more.**

(iii) Cygnus Hospitals

With the objective to provide industry ready and employable candidates, Cygnus Medicare Pvt. Ltd. and Manav Rachna University (MRU) signed an MoU to provide trained manpower in the Health Care sector and joined hands to bring structured BBA (Healthcare Management) program specializing in Health Care Management. This relationship provides students, one year practical training with Cygnus Hospitals.

(iv). SAP (Systems, Applications & Products in Data Processing) student Academy:

An MOU was signed between CL Media (CLM) and Manav Rachna University (MRU) to establish Industry Academic Research Collaboration in areas of Mutual Interest on 27th May 2016. CLM through Accendere shall setup process and produce research papers & external support in publishing in relevant indexed Journals like Scopus/SCI/WOS or present in relevant conferences. Further Accendere would encompass variety of activities enabling the faculty and students understand the process, formation of research groups, selection of faculty mentors from MRU and identification of research topics for research groups.

Accendere would provide all support to enable research groups of students in identifying research problems, literature survey, conducting review of literature, progress in research to its conclusion and publishing research work in relevant journals and filing of Patents if any.

i) National Conference on “Emerging Trends and Innovations in Electronics and Telecommunication Engineering (June 28th, 2016).

3.5 Approval of Research Supervisors

It was submitted for information of the Council that 47 Ph.D. scholars have been pursuing the Ph.D. Program which commenced in January, 2016. All the scholars successfully completed their Course work in July, 2016. The DRC of the Departments have allocated the supervisors for each Research Scholar. A list of Supervisors along with the names of Research Scholars was tabled by the Dean, Research in the Meeting and read for information of the Hon'ble Members. The Hon'ble Members expressed their all praise for creating a Research Environment in the University in such a short span and accepted the recommendations of DRC regarding allocation of Research Supervisors.

Decision: Academic Council approved the allocation of Research Supervisors. Approved list is annexed as Annexure No.,I

3.6 Approval of Admissions made to the UG/PG Programs for the Academic Session, 2016-17.

The Academic Council was informed that admissions to various UG/PG programs for the academic Session 2016-17 were started as per the schedule notified in the Admission Brochure. Right from the June, 2016 when our first counseling was held, the admissions were made in the University till 30th September, 2016 as per the eligibility



condition approved by the Council for various UG/PG programs. Currently, 407 students are admitted to First year of all the UG programs, the details of which are as follows:

The classes were started from different dates i.e. B. Tech.(12.07.2016), B.Sc. (Hons) (08.08.2016) , BBA (14.07.2016) and M.Sc. (08.08.2016).The Program wise details of all the admissions along with the particulars of each student provided to the Members. It was pointed out by the HoD, Management and Dean, Academics that the name of one student was missing from the list of students of M.Sc. Physics similarly there are some discrepancies in the List of Students M.Sc Math and BBA Program. The council was assured that the figure would be rechecked and corrected after ascertaining from the departments. The Council approved the admissions after ascertaining the reasons of low admissions in M. Tech. & MBA programs.

Decision: Academic Council approved the admissions made in all the UG & PG programs for the Academic Session, 2016-17. A revised list of students annexed as Annexure No. II.

3.7 Admission policy for ongoing B.Tech. B.Tech (Lateral), M.Tech., B.Sc. (H), BBA and M.Sc. programs for the Academic Session, 2017-18.

Academic Council was informed that the university shall continue to offer all the existing UG/PG Programs except MBA program, which is proposed to be dropped, during the forthcoming Academic session, 2017-18. It is also purposed to merge B. Tech Information Technology with B. Tech CSE, considering the less admissions in B. Tech. (IT) Program The program wise intake, eligibility condition shall be as follows:

I. Bachelor of Technology Programs (B.Tech.)

The university shall offer for B. Tech. Programs with intake as given below:

1. Computer Science and Engineering	: 240
2. Mechanical Engineering	: 60

The admissions to the above programs shall be made on the basis of entrance test (MRNAT-2017) conducted by the Manav Rachna University. The merit list shall be prepared on the basis of 60% weightage of MRNAT 2017 and 40% weightage of



aggregate marks in qualifying examination. Seats remaining vacant, if any shall be filled on the basis of score in Uni-GAUGE (second preference), JEE-Main 2017 examination (third preference) or marks scored in qualifying examination (last preference).

The following shall be the eligibility criteria:

The candidates should have passed 10 +2 examination from the CBSE/ State Boards or from any other recognized Board/Council with 60% in aggregate marks in 5 subjects with Physics, Mathematics and English as compulsory subjects.

II. Bachelor of Technology (B.Tech.), Lateral Entry.

The university shall also offer the above B.Tech. Programs with intake as given below through lateral entry:

The admissions to the above programs shall be made on the basis of entrance test (MRNAT-2017) conducted by the Manav Rachna University. However, in case of non-availability of the candidates from the above categories, vacant seats, if any, shall be filled on the basis of marks in the qualifying examinations.

The following shall be the eligibility criteria:

The candidates should have passed Diploma in Engineering in the relevant discipline of three years duration from the recognized Board/ or B.Sc. degree with Physics and Mathematics as subjects from a recognized University, as defined by UGC with atleast 60% marks in aggregate.

I) Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.(H)) Programs

The University shall continue to offer the B.Sc.(H) programs in three disciplines i.e. Physics with Intake 15, Chemistry with Intake 30 and Mathematics with intake 20 during the next academic session, 2017-18.

Admission to the above programs shall be made strictly on the basis of merit. The merit shall be determined on the basis of marks or grade obtained in the MRNAT- 2017 and thereafter on the basis of marks in qualifying examination and achievement made in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

The following shall be the eligibility criteria:

Candidates should have passed 10 + 2 examination from any recognized Board with 50% or more marks in aggregate of three Science subjects (Phys., Chem. & Math./Bio)



for B.Sc. (Hons) Chemistry and Phys., Chem. and Math for B.Sc. (Hons) Physics & B.Sc.(Hons) Mathematics along with English.

Bachelor of Business Administration Program

The university shall continue to offer the above program with existing specializations and intake 100 during the session 2017-18 under the Department of Management and Commerce.

Admission to the above programs shall be made strictly on the basis of merit. The merit shall be determined on the basis of marks or grade obtained in the MRNAT- 2017 and thereafter on the basis of marks in qualifying examination.

The following shall be the eligibility criteria for specialization:

BBA (Health Care Management) in association with Cygnus Hospitals:

The Candidates having passed 10+2 examination from any recognized Board with 50% or more marks in aggregate.

BBA (Finance & Accounts) :The candidates having passed 10+2 examination from any recognized Board with 50% or more marks in aggregate.

(The Program has integration with US CMA (Certified Management Accountant) a USA Recognized professional qualification and Association of International Accountants (AIA) aligned curriculum).

BBA (Entrepreneurship & Family Business): The candidates having passed 10+2 examination from any recognized Board with 50% or more marks in aggregate

I). Master of Technology (M.Tech.) Programs

Two M. Tech. Programs, namely, M.Tech. in Computer Engineering (CE), and M.Tech.in Mechanical Engineering (ME) shall continue to be offered during the Session 2017-18 with existing intake 18 in each program.

Admission to the above programs shall be made on the basis of merit in GATE in the relevant stream. However, in the absence of GATE candidates, seat, if any remain vacant shall be filled on the basis of merit in the qualifying examination.

The following shall be the Eligibility Criteria:

M.Tech. (CE):“The candidate should possess B.E/B.Tech. in Computer Science & Engineering/ Computer Technology/ Information Technology/ MCA or equivalent with minimum 55% marks”.



M.Tech. (ME): "The candidate should possess B.E. /B.Tech. in Mechanical Engineering/ Production Engineering/Automobile Engineering/Industrial Engineering/Agriculture Engineering/Aeronautical Engineering/Marine Engineering/Mining & Metallurgy or equivalent with minimum 55% marks".

Master of Science (M.Sc.) Programs

Three M.Sc. Programs, namely, M.Sc. in Physics with Intake 10, Chemistry with Intake 30 and Mathematics with intake 10 will be offered under the Faculty of Applied Sciences during the Session 2017-18.

Admission to the above programs shall be made on the basis of merit in MRNAT- 2017. However, in the absence of candidates, seats, if any remain vacant shall be filled on the basis of merit in the qualifying examination.

The following shall be the Eligibility Criteria:

M.Sc.(Chemistry) : Candidates having passed with 50% or more marks in B.Sc. (Hons.) Chemistry/ 60% marks in B.Sc. General (Physics, Chemistry & Maths/Biology)

M.Sc. (Mathematics) : Candidates having passed with 50% or more marks in B.Sc. (Hons.) Mathematics/60% marks in B.Sc. General (Physics, Chemistry & Maths)

M.Sc.(Physics) : Candidates having passed with 50% or more marks in B.Sc. (Hons.) Physics/60% marks in B.Sc. General (Physics, Chemistry & Maths)

i) Admission of NRI/PIO/ Foreign Nationals in 2017-18

a) Programs offered: The details of the programs available and eligibility criteria shall be same for all the programs as prescribed above.

b) Admission Procedure:

1. NRI/PIO/ Foreign Nationals seeking admissions in different programs in MRU may submit scanned copy of duly filled and signed application form downloadable from MRU website: www.iec.mru.edu.in along with scanned copy of the following certificates:

a). Academic Transcript translated in English (If original transcript is in a language other than English), the translated transcript in English shall have to be attested by Indian Embassy of the candidates Country or Embassy of Candidate's Country in India or by Head of Department, Department of Education, Province / Federal Government of the Candidate's Country.

b). Passport showing the name, address, validity, issuing authority, valid reason if any etc.



- c).The candidates shall also be required to submit two letters of recommendation from the faculty, authorities of their pervious institution/school. In case of application for under graduate program one LOR may preferably be from school counselor.
2. On receipt of application form, MRU shall get the eligibility of the candidate confirmed for the applied academic program and convey to the candidate whether he/ she is eligible for admission or not.
 3. A candidate who has been adjudged eligible for admission in a particular program shall be required to deposit the preliminary fee as under through Bank Transfer, after verification of which **MRU shall issue a Provisional Admission Letter** for facilitating the candidates to apply for Visa.

Prof. R.K. Singh Hon'ble Member of the AC, emphasized that University should try to introduce Interdisciplinary Innovative Programs instead of traditional Programs being offered/proposed to be offered. It was clarified by the Dean, Academic that during initial years of the University we would like to continue these programs but definitely as we progress further we would add Innovative Interdisciplinary programs. An proposal to start a new program B.Tech in Industrial Engineering and Management is already taken up as agenda of this meeting. The Council is requested to approve the proposal.

Decision: Academic Council approved the proposal.

3.8 Policy for admission to B.Ed. & Integrated B.Ed. programs.

The Council was apprised that the University shall offer B.Ed. with Intake 50 & integrated B .Ed programs viz. B.A. B.Ed./ .B.Sc. B.Ed. programs with intake 50 from the session 2017-18 under the Department of Education , approval for which has been obtained from the National Council for Teacher Educations (N.C.T.E) vide their letter no. NRC/NCTE/NRCAPP-10195/256th/meeting/2016/156767.dated 29 Aug, 2016 and Minutes of 257th Meeting of NRC held from 05th to 11th September, 2016 (Part 3) respectively.

Admission to the above programs shall be made strictly on the basis of merit of MRNAT 2017. The merit list shall be prepared on the basis of marks obtained in MRNAT 2017. Seats remaining vacant, if any shall be filled on the basis of marks in qualifying degree.

At the time of admission to the program, the student will need to indicate their selection of the subjects to be pursued for the discipline options and the accompanying pedagogic specializations for which they are applying, and these may be assigned on the basis of order of merit and availability.

Eligibility condition:-



B.Ed. Program (2 years) :- The Candidates should have passed with 50% or more marks aggregate in the Bachelor's degree and/or in Master's Degree in Sciences/Social Sciences/ Humanities, Bachelor's in Engineering or Technology with specialization in Science and Mathematics with 55% marks or any other qualification equivalent.

B.A B.Ed. Integrated (4 years): - The Candidates should have 50% or more marks, in aggregate in any discipline in the Senior Secondary /+ 2 or equivalent examinations conducted by any recognized Central/State Boards.

B.Sc B.Ed Integrated (4 Years): - The Candidates should have 50 % marks in aggregate in relevant discipline (Science- Medical/ Non Medical stream) in the Senior Secondary /+ 2 or equivalent examinations conducted by any recognized Central/State Boards.

Further, Council was apprised that University intents to continue with the Policy/Directive of the Director of Higher Education, Haryana received vide Memo No. 18/51-2000 UNP(4) endorsed on 29.12.2015 with regard to Kashmiri Migrants in the next academic year also which is as follows-

Reservation and Relaxation to wards of Kashmiri migrants in all the UG Programs

- i) Relaxation in cut-off percentage up to 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirements,
- ii) Increase in intake capacity up to 5% course-wise.
- iii) Reservation of at least one seat in merit quota in technical/ professional institutions,
- iv) Waiving of domicile requirement.

Council was requested to approve the proposal.

Decision: Academic Council approved the same.

**3.9 Introduction of a new PG Program Master of Arts in Education
M.A.(Education)**

Academic Council was informed that University shall offer a new program M.A. in Education with intake 20 under the Department of Education from the Academic Session, 2017-18. A proposal to this effect has already been submitted to the Department of Higher Education, Govt.of Haryana on 14.09.2016 and a presentation also made before the ACS to the Govt., Haryana. Approval of the Govt. for starting the above program has been received vides their Memo no. 20 / 5- 2013 UNP (5), dated 30.09.2016.



Admission to the above programs shall be made on the basis of merit in MRNAT- 2017. However, in the absence of candidates, seats, if any remain vacant shall be filled on the basis of merit in the qualifying examination

The following shall be the Eligibility Criteria:

The candidates having passed with 50% or more marks in graduation in any discipline (with or without education as specialization

The Council was requested to approve the Proposal.

Decision: Academic Council approved the above

3.10 Introduction of LLB (3 years), B.A.L.L.B (5yrs), BALLB (5yrs) and B.Com. LLB(5 yrs) Programs from the Academic session,2017-18.

The Council was apprised that the University intends to start four new law programs viz.LLB (3 years), B.A.L.L.B (5yrs), BALLB (5yrs) and B.Com LLB(5 yrs) Programs from the Academic Session, 2017-18.with intake 60 in each program under the Department of Law/ Faculty of Law, creation of which has been approved by the Board of Management in its fourth meeting held on 28.09.2016. A proposal to start the above programs has already been submitted to the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Haryana on 15.07.2016 and a presentation also made before the ACS to the Govt., Haryana on 14.09.2016. Approval of the Govt. for starting the above programs has been received vide their Memo no. 20 / 5 - 2013 UNP (5) dated 30.09.2016.

The university shall apply to the Bar Council of India to seek its approval to start the above programs.

Admission to the above programs shall be made on the basis of merit in MRNAT- 2017. However, in the absence of candidates, seats, if any remain vacant shall be filled on the basis of merit in the qualifying examination.

The following shall be the Eligibility Criteria:

LLB: The candidates should have passed the Graduation in any stream with 50% or more marks.

B.A. LLB (Integrated) : The Candidates should have passed 10+2 with 50% or more marks aggregate.

BBA LLB(Integrated): The candidates should have passed 10+2 with 50% or more marks aggregate.



B.Com. LLB (Integrated):The candidates should have passed 10+2 with 50% or more marks aggregate.

The Council was requested to approve the proposal for starting the above programs.

Decision: Academic approved the proposal to start the above Law programs.

3.11 Approval of Regulation on Unfair means in the Examination

Academic Council was informed that as per the provisions envisaged in sub clause iv (e) of the clause 8 of the First Statutes, the Academic Council has power to frame such regulations as are consistent with the statutes and ordinances regarding academic functions of the University, discipline, residence, admissions and examinations. A draft Regulation on the use of unfair means in the Examination, prepared by the Committee headed by the Dean, Examination, was tabled in the Second Meeting of the Council wherein it was decided that the Regulation be reviewed and taken up in the next meeting of the Council. The revised Regulation was placed before the Council for their perusal. There was a suggestion by the Members that the name of the Unfair Committee should be changed. After deliberation it was resolved that the Unfair Means Committee should be called as the Committee for prevention of Unfair Means in the examinations with this amendment in the regulation, it was unanimously approved.

Decision: Academic Council approved the above Regulation with modification that “Unfair Means Committee” should be substituted with the “Committee for prevention of unfair means” at all the places in the Regulation. Approved Regulation is annexed as Annexure No.III.

3.12 Approval of Regulation on prevention of Plagiarism in Research Work

Hon'ble members are well aware that Teaching & research is a novel profession based on extremely high moral values. There cannot be any room for claiming the credit for the work one has not undertaken. Many times it is observed that some of the “academicians/Research Scholars” knowingly or unknowingly publish or present other's work as their own. Such acts not only affect healthy academic atmosphere but also harms the reputation of the institute as well as the individual. It is, therefore, important for an academic institute to have in place a policy on plagiarism to avoid such type of acts.

Considering the above, a Regulation on prevention of Plagiarism in Research Work was prepared by the University for Consideration of the Council. The Council was requested to approve the same. The Hon'ble Members said that the Regulation was well drafted



and covers all the points even the cases of plagiarism at the level of UG/PG Programs/Projects. The regulation was approved unanimously.

Decision: Academic Council approved the above Regulation on prevention of Plagiarism in Research Work. Approved Regulation is Annexed as Annexure No. IV.

3.13 Reorganization of Master in Business Administration (MBA) Programs

The Academic Council was informed that University intends to reorganize the MBA programs from the academic session, 2017-18 for the reasons these programs are not attracting adequate number of candidates, the number of aspirants have reduced to such a level it is becoming difficult to sustain this program. The reorganization of the program has also become necessary for logistical optimization.

The clause 8 (x) (b) of the First Statutes of the University which is approved and notified by the Haryana Education Department , Haryana Government vide Notification No.KW 20/5-2013 UNP (5) dated the 2nd February, 2016, empowers the Council to propose introduction, modification and removal of programs leading to award of degrees, diplomas and certificates.

In view of the above, it is proposed to reorganize all the MBA Programs from the session, 2017-18. The classes shall be held in conjunction with MRIU students of the similar programs.

Hon'ble members deliberated over the proposal and approved the same.

Decision: Academic Council approved the proposal.

3.14 Any other matter with the permission of chair.

1. Approval of Program Structure & Syllabus for B. Tech. Computer Science & Engineering

Academic Council was informed that the Program Structure for all the Semester of the above two B. Tech programs were approved by the Board of Management in its first meeting held on 10.03.2015. The program is now in 3rd Semester, the teaching instructions were imparted during the first two semester as per the draft syllabus and the Third Semester teachings is on the basis of the draft syllabus of the programs. Since, the examinations are due to be held in the Month of Dec 2016, it has become inevitable to get the same approved by the statutory bodies. The BoS of the Department and BoF of Faculty of Engineering have already approved the Draft syllabus for the



above Programs. Now, it is placed before the Academic Council for its consideration and approval.

The Council after deliberation approved the proposed syllabus for B. Tech. Computer Science & Engineering with advice that henceforth, it should be submitted well in advance of the date of the Meeting.

Decision: Academic Council approved the syllabus and program structure of B. Tech. Computer Science & Engineering with the stipulation that henceforth, such documents be submitted for perusal of the Members of the Council well in advance of the date of scheduled Meeting.

Supplementary Agenda

S.A.1 Approval of Admission Brochure for the Academic Year 2017-18

Academic Council was informed that a team of senior faculty members under the supervision of the Dean, Academics prepared the draft of the Admission Brochure, 2017-18 which is placed for consideration of the Hon'ble members of the council. One of the Hon'ble Member mentioned that there was no need to place it before the Council. It was clarified by the Registrar that there are various issues technical in nature such as dates of Counseling and last date of closing of admission, procedures to be followed by the Admission Committee etc. which sometimes helps in litigation matters and therefore it is submitted, to the Council for its concurrence. The Council after having gone through the contents in brief, approved the same.

Decision: Academic Council approved the same.

S.A.2 Introduction of New B. Tech. Program, Industrial Engineering & Management from 2017-18

It was submitted for information of the Council that the Department of Mechanical Engineering of the University intends to start a new B. Tech Program in Industrial Engineering & Management with intake 30 from the academic session, 2017-18. The bachelor degree program in Industrial Engineering & Management communicates the basics of technical and scientific subjects, and equips students with a broad spectrum of knowledge in engineering. In specialized courses the students additionally acquire scientific competence in technically relevant and economic areas of focus, as well as social skills. Industrial engineers and managers are in demand all over the world: Graduates are endowed with the necessary expertise, methodological competence, and problem-solving skills to cope with technological challenges under consideration of economic aspects, and to recognize and make creative use of promising business



opportunities. Academic Council was requested to approve the proposal for starting the above B. Tech. program which the council approved unanimously.

Decision: Academic Council approved the same.

S.A.3 Approval of Program Structure & Syllabus for First year of the BBA and MBA Programs

Hon'ble members of the Academic Council were informed that the University has been offering the MBA Programs with different specializations under the Department of Management and Commerce from session 2015-16 and started offering BBA programs with specialization in Health Care Management, Finance and Accounts and Family Business & Entrepreneurship, as approved by the Council and Board of management from the session 2016-17. The MBA programs is in its 2nd Year. The program structure for the MBA program was approved by the Board of Management in its first meeting held on 10.03.2015. First Semester of the BBA Program is in progress, teaching instructions for MBA & BBA Programs are being given to the students as per the draft Curriculum of the programs. End Semester examinations are scheduled to be held in the month of December, 2016, therefore, it has become necessary to get the syllabus for the MBA Programs and 1st Semester Syllabus for BBA programs approved by the Statutory bodies. The BoS and Board of Faculty have already approved the Program Structure and Syllabus of the above programs. The copies of the syllabus were placed for consideration of the Hon'ble members of the council.

Prof. R.K. Singh, Hon'ble Member of the Council tried to ascertain the need for bringing the syllabus and program structure of the MBA for approval of the Council when program was proposed to be discontinued. He was clarified that the Students pursuing MBA program from the session 2015-16 are now in 3rd Semester, program is still in progress. Therefore, it was felt necessary to get the same approved by the Council. Further, it was pointed out by him that soft copy of the syllabus and program structure should have been sent at least one week in advance of the date of the Meeting for perusal of the Members as is not pragmatic for the Members to go through the contents of the syllabus and offer comments thereon in the meeting itself being voluminous in nature. The views expressed by the Prof. Singh was appreciated by all. With this clarification/submission the Council approved the proposed syllabus and program Structure for the above two programs i.e. BBA & MBA.

Decision: Academic Council approved the syllabus and program structure of MBA & BBA 1st semester with stipulation that henceforth, such documents be submitted for perusal of the Members of the Council at least seven days in advance of the date of scheduled Meeting.



S.A.4 Approval of Program Structure & Syllabus for B. Sc. (Hons.) & M. Sc. Programs - Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics.

It was submitted for information of the Academic Council that the Faculty of Applied Sciences through the Depts. of Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics has been offering the B.Sc. Honors Programs from the session, 2015-16 and started offering M.Sc. programs from the session 2017-18 with the approval of the Council, Board and the Govt. B.Sc. Hons programs are in 2nd year and M. Sc. programs are in progress. Teaching instructions are being given to the students as per the draft Curriculum for both the programs. End Semester examinations are scheduled to be held in the month of December, 2016, therefore, it has become imperative to get the syllabus for both the programs approved by the statutory bodies. The BoS of the Departments and Board of Faculty of Faculty of Applied Sciences have already approved the Program Structure and the syllabus of the above programs. The copies of the syllabus were placed for consideration of the Hon'ble members of the council. The Council after deliberation approved the same.

Decision: Academic Council approved the syllabus and program structure of B.Sc (Hons.) and M.Sc. with the stipulation that henceforth, such documents be submitted for perusal of the Members of the Council at least seven days in advance of the date of scheduled Meeting.

Regulations on Unfair Means in Examinations

In exercise of the power conferred in sub clause iv (e) of the clause 8 of the First Statutes, read with section 34 of the Haryana Private Universities Act, 2006, and further amended as Haryana Private Universities (Second Short Title Amendment) Act 2014 (Haryana Act no. 26 of 2014), the Academic Council of the Manav Rachna University with the approval of the Board of Management hereby makes the Regulation relating to Unfair Means in the Examination.

1) Short Title, Application and Commencement

- This Regulation shall be called the Manav Rachna University (First) Regulation, 2016
- This shall apply to all the students enrolled in Manav Rachna University.
- This shall come in force from the date of approval of the Board of Management.

2) Definition

In this regulation unless the context otherwise requires;

- 'Invigilator' shall mean a faculty/staff of the University assigned with invigilation work in the examinations.
- 'Superintendent' shall mean a faculty member of the University assigned with responsibility to conduct examinations.
- 'Committee for prevention of Unfair Means' shall mean Committee for prevention of Unfair Means of the Manav Rachna University.

Words and expression used but not defined in the Regulation and defined Act, Statute and Ordinances shall have the meaning respectively as assigned them in the Act, Statute and Ordinances.

3) Objective

To scrutinize the charges on the student and impose suitable penalty, if proved.

4) Constitution of the Committee for prevention of Unfair Means

a) The Committee for prevention of Unfair Means shall be constituted by the Vice Chancellor of the University as under

- A senior Professor of the University to be nominated as Chair Person
- Two Senior Professor/ Associate Professor of the University shall be Member of the Committee
- Controller of Examination shall be Member Secretary of the Committee.

5) Function of the Committee for prevention of Unfair Means:

The Committee for prevention of Unfair Means shall perform the following functions-

- To consider the matters relating to alleged use of unfair means in the Examinations.
- To enquire into alleged act of unfair means during examination referred to it by the Controller of the Examinations.



iii. To give personal hearing to the students involved in alleged act of unfair means.

iv. To submit their finding, conclusion and recommendation for quantum of punishment under the provision of this regulation to the Vice Chancellor.

- Where the candidate is guilty of gross misbehavior in connection with the examination with the Invigilator on duty or the other staff working at the examination and is also guilty of assault or inflicting any injury on such person.
- Where candidate is guilty of forging the signatures of an authority on the record book presented as a part of practical examination or on any document required in connection with the examination.

Cancellation of entire two (current & next) semesters for the offender. Under extreme circumstance the punishment will extend to debarring the student for two more semesters or expulsion of the student from the university.

- He/She will register the courses after two semesters for next semester with next batch afresh to pursue his/her degree course & can appear in supplementary examination to clear his/her backlogs. His/Her degree will be extended by one year.

7. Procedure for Processing the Cases:

7.1 Procedure to be followed by Invigilator:

The Invigilator-in-charge of the room/hall shall immediately take the possession of the answer book along with the relevant material found with the student both duly signed by the student. The Invigilator-in-charge shall get the prescribed form for unfair means filled and signed by the student and give his/her comments on the same. If the student does not hand over the relevant material and/or refuses to fill up and sign the prescribed form the same shall be recorded on the prescribed form. He shall then issue another answer book and marked as Answer Book II and the student will continue to work in that book. No extra time will be given for completing the examination as a result of this exercise. After the examinations is over these answer books duly marked as I and II, the material found in possession and the prescribed form duly filled and signed by the Invigilator-in-charge shall be delivered separately to the Controller of examination for the necessary action. All other answer books shall be sent to the Coordinator/Examiner as usual.

7.2 Procedure to be followed by Controller of examination:

The controller of examination along with Committee for prevention of Unfair Means shall thoroughly examine the case(s) on the basis of the material/documents placed and shall submit the findings after laying down clearly the nature of offense listed along with proposed action to be taken.

The Controller of examination after his due consideration of the case(s) shall pass orders accordingly.

1) Short Title, Application and Commencement

- (a) This Regulation shall be called the Manav Rachna University (Third) Regulation, 2016
- (b) This shall apply to all the Faculty Members and students of Manav Rachna University.
- (c) This shall come in force from the date of approval of the Board of Management.

2) Preamble:

Ethics and honesty are the two most important components of the academic activities; be it teaching or research. Teaching and research being part of a novel profession are based on extremely high moral values. There cannot be any room for claiming the credit for the work he/she has not undertaken. Many times it is observed that some of the "academicians" knowingly or unknowingly publish or present others work as their own. Such acts affect healthy academic atmosphere in the institution which along with harming the reputation of the institution also harms the individual.

Manav Rachna University (MRU) considers Plagiarism as an unacceptable practice and detrimental to intellectual and moral development of an individual. Individuals found to be indulging in acts of plagiarism will face academic and disciplinary proceedings as per the discretion of Faculty Guide and Academic and Examination Department

It is therefore important for an academic institution to have in place a policy on plagiarism to avoid such type of malafide acts.

3) Definition of Plagiarism:

Plagiarism is defined as presenting another person's work as one's own work. Presentation includes copying or reproducing it without the acknowledgement of the source.

Plagiarism involves copying of: phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or longer extracts from published or unpublished work (including from the Internet) that exceeds the boundaries of the legitimate cooperation without acknowledgement of the source. Plagiarism could be intentional (dishonest plagiarism) or non-intentional (negligent plagiarism).



i) Negligent Plagiarism:

Negligent plagiarism means innocently or carelessly presenting another person's work as one's own without acknowledging the source. It arises from one's inadequate knowledge and competency in writing. It is also due to careless attitude resulting into non-compliance of standard verification procedures. In this type of plagiarism the degree of copying is not substantial.

ii) Dishonest Plagiarism:

Dishonest plagiarism means knowingly and deliberately presenting another person's work as one's own work without acknowledging the source. It involves intentional copying of substantial proportions of the other's work without written or unwritten permission and also without acknowledging the source.

iii) Words and expression used but not defined in the Regulation and defined Act, Statute and Ordinances shall have the meaning respectively as assigned them in the Act, Statute and Ordinances.

4) Guidelines for Students and Research Scholars to avoid plagiarism

Students and Research Scholars are expected to conduct their research work in responsible and ethical manner. Research work submitted by each individual will be subjected to plagiarism test using software tools. A plagiarism certificate mentioning the degree of plagiarism in the report will be issued to each individual by the Faculty. If an individual is found guilty, the matter will be reported to the Academics and Examination department and penalties and sanctions will be imposed depending on the degree of plagiarism.

5) General instructions for the Students and Research Scholars to avoid plagiarism

- a) Learn the conventions for citing and acknowledging sources while doing research
- b) Document your work by taking the note of the source you are referring
- c) Consult your guide when you are unsure of how to cite
- d) Write in your own words
- e) Develop comprehension and critical analysis skills
- f) Learn time management skill to explore the topic in depth and also to avoid last rush of submitting research work

6) Guidelines for Faculty/Guide/Supervisor

Each Faculty is expected to assume the responsibility of avoiding plagiarism at Under Graduate, Post Graduate and Ph.D. level to promote and maintain the academic integrity. Each Faculty is required to issue a certificate to the students and Research Scholars at Under Graduate, Post



Graduate and Ph. D. level at the time of the submission of the thesis stating the extent of plagiarism in their research work. If any individual is found to be guilty the matter will be reported to Academic and Examination Department. If any Faculty is found to be issuing wrong information regarding the extent/degree of plagiarism on the certificate of any student or Research Scholar then severe action will be taken against the concerned Faculty. Each Faculty is expected to become aware about the concept of plagiarism, kinds of plagiarism and methods to avoid plagiarism and how to use plagiarism detecting softwares.

7) **General Instructions for the Faculty to avoid plagiarism**

- a) State the MRU's Plagiarism Policy to the students and Research Scholars in the beginning of your course clearly explaining the consequences of committing plagiarism acts.
- b) Teach the students and Research Scholars how to cite and acknowledge sources in the research work
- c) Explain clearly to the students and Research Scholars the difference between Quoting, Paraphrasing and Summarizing by giving examples
- d) Try to design new assignments every semester which encourage students and Research Scholars in exploring a topic in depth
- e) Help each student and Research Scholar in identifying the topic of research which will reduce the chances of plagiarism
- f) Encourage students and Research Scholars to develop habit of writing in their own words
- g) Make documentation of research work mandatory for students and Research Scholars
- h) Monitor the work of students and Research Scholars in phases by collecting smaller parts of assignment to keep a check on the progress and quality of the work
- i) Provide help to students and Research Scholars who face problems in documenting and using citing conventions
- j) Make use of software to detect the extent of plagiarism in the research work of the student and Research Scholar
- k) Issue Plagiarism Certificate to students and Research Scholars mentioning the degree of plagiarism in the report;
- l) Synopsis and full Thesis shall be uploaded on Shodagangotri and Shodhganga for widespread circulation. Plagiarism, if any shall be detected. This conforms to the direction of UGC.

8) **Academic and Disciplinary proceedings**

Plagiarism of any sort is unacceptable at all levels of Under-Graduate, Post Graduate and Ph. D. programmes. All the cases of plagiarism will be reported to Academic and Examination Department. Any individual found to be committing acts of plagiarism will face academic and disciplinary proceedings depending on the degree of plagiarism.



9) **Guidelines for action:**

The University will form a committee of three experts who will establish whether there is a plagiarism or not, if it is then what is the level. This committee will also have Head of the concerned Department as an ex-officio member. This committee will submit its report to the Vice Chancellor who will take up it further with the Academic Council/Board of Management (If decides so) for a final decision in this regard. The committee of experts will use the best possible software provided by UGC or National Knowledge Commission for detecting the plagiarism. Depending on the severity of crime the punishment could be:

a) **Under Graduate Programmes**

For the plagiarism of **minor** nature, the penalty would normally be reprimand i.e. an official warning issued in writing that repeating the same behavior may lead to severe penalties and getting an undertaking signed by the student where he agrees to make necessary changes in the report. On repeating the same offence, it would be identified as offence of major nature and following penalty will be applicable:

- (i) For the plagiarism of **major** nature, the penalty would be assigning zero marks to the student in that assignment or report.

b) **Post Graduate Programmes**

For the plagiarism of **minor** nature, the penalty would normally be reprimand i.e. an official warning issued in writing that repeating the same behavior may lead to severe penalties and getting an undertaking signed by the student where he agrees to make necessary changes in the report. In addition to this, some marks would be deducted.

On repeating the same offence, it would be identified as offence of major nature and following penalty will be applicable:

- (ii) For the plagiarism of **major** nature, the penalty would be assigning zero marks for that report or zero marks for all the assessments in that year or one year suspension to the student.

c) **Ph. D Programme**

(i) **For Research Scholars**

For the plagiarism of **minor** nature, the penalty would normally be reprimand i.e. an official warning issued in writing that repeating the same behavior may lead to severe penalties and getting an undertaking signed by the Research Scholar where he agrees to make necessary changes in the report. In addition to this, some marks would be deducted and Research Scholar may be prohibited from using college facilities like laboratories, library for some time period.



On repeating the same offence, it would be identified as offence of major nature and following penalty will be applicable:

For the plagiarism of **major** nature, the penalty would be revocation of the Ph.D. degree award and expulsion of the Research Scholar from the University permanently. Permanent remarks mentioning the act committed would be added in the file of the Research Scholar and the Research Scholar would be excluded from all future assessments of the University.

(ii) **For Faculty**

In case of the Faculty pursuing Ph. D. from MRU, if **minor** nature plagiarism occurs, the penalty would normally be reprimand i.e. an official warning issued in writing that repeating the same behavior may lead to severe penalties and getting an undertaking signed by the Faculty where he agrees to make necessary changes in the report. In addition to this, some marks would be deducted and the Faculty may be prohibited from using college facilities like laboratories, library for some time period.

In addition to above penalty there would be reduction in the increment of the concerned Faculty.

If **major** nature plagiarism occurs, the penalty would be revocation of the Ph. D. degree award and the increment would be set off for next one year or Faculty would be suspended for some time period
