

Temporary Anchorage Devices (TADs)

TADs are very small titanium screws which are inserted right into the jaw bone. Available in different sizes according to the need of the treatment.



Placing and removing TADS is a minimally-invasive, pain-free procedure.

Anesthetic gel is applied on the gums and patient feels only gentle pressure as the device is inserted.

TADs are hooked to braces on the teeth to aid in space closure, midline correction, bite closure, and many other functions.

Typically, TADs are only needed for a few months during orthodontic treatment to facilitate a certain tooth movement.

Rinsing twice a day with an anti-bacterial mouthwash & using a toothbrush is required.
